

"I recommend that an additional worship service geared for younger adults, youth, and children (especially with no significant church connection) be added to St.Andrew. This style of postmodern worship service will continue to be very meaningful to the current congregation that already attends that worship service and too many of those who are unchurched in your ministry area (particularly persons who are unchurched and those under 45 years of age). This service would be held in the Fellowship Hall (previous sanctuary) at 10:30 AM on Sunday with a relaxed style that is inviting and open to everyone, especially those that are younger and unchurched."

"...Yes, you would have concurrent services at 2 venues at 10:30 AM with 2 preachers – like is common in a very large church). This service is to be truly an EPIC worship service (which means Experiential, Participatory, Image Driven, and Connecting to God through others – as described in Leonard Sweet's book Postmodern Pilgrims.) It would be developed by a worship team, led by the new associate pastor as the primary preacher."






